The Hospitality courses at Tauondi College are designed for people looking to enter in the Hospitality Industry by gaining qualifications as a qualified cook or working at an operative level in a range of hospitality establishments.

Career Opportunities and Career Pathways

The course is offered over two semesters full-time or can also be taken by part time study.

A professional cook may work in a range of food outlets, including fast food takeaways, coffee shops, bistros, school canteens, patisseries, clubs, catering operations, restaurants or ocean cruise ships.

Hospitality Operations career pathways may include bar attendant, waiter, food and beverage runner, porter, coffee shop assistant, accommodation services or gaming.

Students who successfully complete the programs are able to articulate with and receive credits for relevant units of competency from other qualifications in the Tourism, Hospitality and Events Training Package (SIT).

Entry Requirements

Applicants must meet the minimum requirements for enrolment. The eligibility criteria is vital in ensuring successful completion.

- Minimum 16 years of age
- Proof of Aboriginality
- Validated Unique Student Identifier (USI)
- Completion and results of Tauondi LL&N assessment
- Interview with Trainer for Certificate III qualification
- Physical capabilities required to successfully complete training and assessment requirements as per qualifications
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to be purchased prior to commencement

Simulated Catering and Restaurant Environment

At Tauondi Aboriginal College we have an excellent opportunity for a hands on experience with the operation of our café on student training days as well as our simulated restaurant environment.

Work Placements

Students must undertake work placement between 12 and 48 service periods depending on the qualification level. Host employers may require students on work placement to undergo a National Criminal History Records Check and have further training such as applied first aid, manual handling or child safe environments prior to the commencement of their work placement. Tauondi College will also support students in gaining these certificates.

Tauondi Support Service Centre will assist students with mentors for work experience and employment.

Duration

Certificate II in Kitchen Operations incorporating Certificate I in Hospitality -two academic terms;

Certificate II in Hospitality - two academic terms;

Certificate III in Commercial Cookery - four academic terms;

runs four days a week Monday to Thursday 9 am – 3 pm.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

If you have previous experience, you may be eligible for recognition of prior learning for certain units in the course. RPL recognises that you may already have the competencies required either through past studies or life/work experience. You can discuss this with your trainer further if you feel you have skills and knowledge relevant to your course.
