SITXFSA001 – Use Hygienic Practices for Food Safety

SITHIND001 – Use Hygienic Practice for Hospitality Service

and

Other non-accredited components

Individuals will be provided with an engaging three (3) week interactive program. You will learn a range of customer service skills, basic knowledge of food safety, personal hygiene and kitchen functions that will assist you in entering the hospitality industry.

Successful completion of these units may lead to employment in a variety of hospitality settings such as: restaurants, hotels, function centres, clubs, pubs and cafes. Job possibilities include: catering assistant, fast food cook, breakfast cook, glass runner, food runner, kitchen steward and sandwich hand.

Accredited units:

- SITHIND001 – Use hygienic practice for hospitality service *

** To be assessed in this unit the student must complete SITXFSA001 - Use hygienic practices for food safety.*

Other program components (non-accredited):

- Customer Service Essentials (Front of House)
- Introduction/basics of responsible service of alcohol

Course Duration

Four (4) days a week: **Tuesday to Friday 9.30 am - 3 pm for 3 weeks**

Training Location & Modes of Delivery

Training is conducted at **Living Kurna Cultural Centre Warraparinga Way (off Stuart Rd) Bedford Park**. Training is delivered through a blend of Trainer led classes, practical demonstrations and workshops. Students work through manuals, learning activities, group work and accredited assessments in a supported and nurturing environment.

Tauondi Aboriginal College will support students in gaining any of these requirements. Tauondi Student Services and Tauondi Career Services assists students with mentoring.



Entry Requirements

The eligibility criteria are vital in ensuring successful completion of the accredited units. Applicants must meet the minimum requirements for enrolment, including:

- Be a minimum of 17 years of age
- Be of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent
- Possess a valid Unique Student Identifier (USI)
- Must be registered with Tauondi's Career Service Program
- Physical capabilities required to successfully complete training and assessment requirements as per qualifications

Fees

This qualification is provided to eligible Aboriginal and Torres Strait people at no charge.

Other Costs/Training Requirements

Students must acquire required uniforms prior to commencement of the program. Tauondi will provide personal protective equipment (PPE) prior to commencement of the program (apron, gloves, and hairnet). Students not in required uniform and PPE will not be allowed to participate in practical classes. Requirements include:

- ESSENTIAL - Sturdy closed-in black shoes with non-slip soles (not sneakers or canvas shoes)
- DESIRABLE - Black top (either collared shirt or polo)
- DESIRABLE - Long black work pants

Recognised Prior Learning

Tauondi Aboriginal College recognises the importance of skills and knowledge that you bring to the college. You may have gained these in the workforce, through previous study or even life experience. Recognition of Prior Learning (**RPL**) is a process that tries to match these skills and knowledge to the outcomes of your chosen course.

Tauondi will recognise any qualifications and statements of attainment gained from other registered training organisations. Credit Transfer (**CT**) will be applied.
